## From the Desk of the EAD/ADFA



They say that it's a sign of increasing age when we find ourselves noting that time is traveling ever faster. But I confess that I am no sooner finished writing this editorial, when the next one is coming due. April has been busy with many events and notable occasions, and for many of our students, a hectic month of completing requirements in order to ensure that graduation will happen in May. By the time we are preparing our next issue of this newsletter, that auspicious event will have passed.

Despite the demands of our professional lives, which never cease to stimulate and challenge, I personally try to make time to read outside the immediate confines of professional life. Last month I read a book just published, which turned out to be a bridge between some of our topical themes in Oral Health Care and the greater world outside. *TEETH*, with the subtitle of *The Story of Beauty, Inequality, and the Struggle for Oral Health in America*, is a compelling journey through the history of dentistry in the US, but against a continuous theme of the unequal provision of oral care in a polarized society. Mary Otto is a distinguished journalist who has published and been widely recognized for her insights and intelligent commentary on many issues related to health care. As many will know, it was she who brought into public focus the tragic story of [Deamonte Driver](#), in 2007, which subsequently had a major effect on policy. I strongly recommend this reader-friendly and thoughtful summary of where we are in society as health care providers, and where we ought to be.

Our annual IUSD Research Day was host to a fine representation of our faculty, staff and student scholarship.

Emeritus, and distinguished IU Professor, Dr. George Stookey, was the guest keynote speaker. Back to my aging theme, but I realized that those young faculty, and of course students, heard the wisdom from an icon of international dental research, but some of us had the privilege of first-hand mentoring by George. Again, speaking personally, it was he who encouraged me to come and set up a lab at IUSD. Congratulations to all who contributed and especially the prize winners and their mentors.

Each Spring, the chancellor presides over the Chancellor's Academic Honors Convocation, to highlight the accomplishments of faculty, students and campus partners, who have shone above the normal heights of achievement. IUSD was well-represented. Our previously recognized Trustees Teaching Awardees, Drs. Richard Gregory, Paul Edwards, Lisa Willis and Dan Shin, and also Dr. Jeff Dean were cited. It was a great pleasure to see the Award for Outstanding Undergraduate Research going to Cade Bradley-Thomas Jacobs, from The School of Informatics, for his work with our own Dr. Travis Bellicchi. This group has become internationally famous for their highly innovative work in reconstructive maxillofacial rehabilitation. Travis was recognized for the same, a few days earlier, in the campus "Elite 50" awards, for graduate and professional students. Congratulations to all!

In another ceremony of recognition, the annual OKU/SPA Awards Luncheon was held in Hine Hall. While the main focus is on high-achieving dental and hygiene students in their respective honor societies, each year, one dental fulltime faculty member is elected to OKU on the basis of academic and professional contributions. This year, the membership was

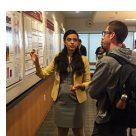
conferred upon Dr. Liz Ramos - a well-deserved recognition indeed!

A brief mention of some international activities: I should have been accompanying VP David Zaret, Dean Paul Halverson and Dr. Sue Babich (both of the School of Public Health) to continue developing the groundwork for collaboration with the Tehran University of Medical Sciences. Regrettably, the global political climate is not conducive to such activity currently, and so none of us was granted a visa to travel. We must hope for enlightenment.

We at IUSD and the campus had two important visitors. Mr. Tom Snell, Director of International Partnerships at the University of Newcastle, UK, already a partner institution with IUPUI, came to meet with Drs. Chris Guba and Joan Kowolik, to discuss the ongoing Study Abroad Program, in which some of our students have already participated. The Dean of Moi Medical School in Kenya, Dr. Lukoye Atwoli, spent a week on campus. Included in his itinerary, he joined us for lunch just prior to our Research Day events, and then later in the week met with Dean Emeritus Larry Goldblatt and I to discuss ways forward in our relationship with the Dental School at Moi. IUSM has been engaged in West Africa for almost 25 years.

In closing, we in OFA congratulate all the dental, hygiene, assisting and graduate students who will cross the stages in May, and wish them all a successful and fulfilling career.

# Welcome New Faculty

As May kicks off so does a new faculty role for the newest member of IUSD's department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry, and Dental Public Health. Formerly an associate clinical professor at the New York University College of Dentistry, on May 1st Dr. Duarte joined the department as an associate professor. Her position is research-focused and will involve conducting research in biofilm and/or related disciplinary areas. Additionally, Dr. Duarte will have teaching responsibilities that include didactic



and clinical instruction in cariology at the pre-doctoral and post-doctoral dental student levels. She has both a PhD and Master's in pharmacology from Brazil's Dental School of Piracicaba, State University of Campinas, Piracicaba, where she also completed her DDS. Coming with her will be her funded NIH (R21) research project titled, "The systemically-compromised miniature pig as a translational model for osseointegration," plus her visiting international scholar, Dr. Sarah Guedes of Brazil. Dr. Guedes, who will be here through June 2017, is a PhD candidate at the Federal University of Ceará in Brazil, where she received her master's and DDS degrees. The department of Orthodontics

& Oral Facial Genetics adds Dr. Junmei Wang to its team on May 1st also. Dr. Wang will be a postdoctoral fellow in the Mineralized Tissue and Histology Research Laboratory under the mentorship of Dr. Achint Utreja, Assistant Professor, Department of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics. 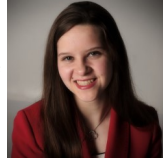
Amber Kriech, Bepko Scholar and Dean's List honoree, will also be addressing the

## Curriculum Enhancement Grants

The Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL) offers a grant called the Curriculum Enhancement Grant (CEG). The purpose of the CEG is to provide faculty with support, time, and resources to implement projects designed to improve student learning and success at IUPUI and IUPUI Columbus. In addition, it is expected that the grants will increase faculty competitiveness for external educational or curricular improvement grants and increase the number of faculty involved in pursuing the scholarship of teaching and learning.

The CTL has announced the grant awards for 2017. The Office of Faculty Affairs is pleased to announce that we have several

faculty members who have received a CEG award for their submitted proposal.

Lisa Maxwell, Clinical Assistant Professor and Dental Hygiene Program Director, Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs, received notification that her proposal, *Incorporating Online Ethics Modules into the Dental Hygiene Curriculum Using Standardized Patients*, was selected to receive a CEG award in the amount of \$10,000.

Joan Kowolik, Associate Professor, Department of Pediatric Dentistry and Richard Jackson, Associate Professor, Department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry and Dental Public Health, also received CEG funding for their project, *A Summer Clinical Practicum for*

*Oral and Systemic Health Screening Assessment of Pediatric Patients*. Drs. Kowolik and Jackson will be collaborating with School of Nursing faculty members, Dr. Kathleen Kent, Clinical Assistant Professor, Community & Health Systems and Dr. Carol Clark, Clinical Assistant Professor, Community & Health Systems. This interprofessional education project involves nurse practitioner students and dental students with the goal to learn and exchange skills that lead to improved early care for children.

CEG award recipients are expected complete and submit their final project report in June 2018 and present a poster at the CEJ Symposium in October 2018. *Congrats!*

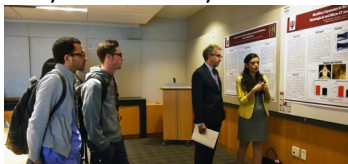

# Research Day Highlights

The 25th Indiana University School of Dentistry Research Day was held on Monday April 10, 2017 from 12:00 pm to 4:30 pm at the IUPUI Campus Center. It was not just an incredible afternoon of reflecting on and honoring our proud history in the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of and academic practices in oral disease. It also was an incredible afternoon of hearing and learning about the present and future research destined to transform how we practice, deliver, and teach oral care over the next 25 years. Remarks by Drs. John Williams (Dean, IU School of Dentistry), Faith Hawkins (Associate Vice President for Research, Strategic Research Initiatives, Indiana University), Dr. George Stookey (Distinguished Professor Emeritus, Oral Health Research Institute, IU

# IUSD Building News



Adam Smith, Director of Facilities Planning & Auxiliary Operations, reports the following construction update on the IUSD Fritts Clinical Center. The roofing on the building connectors is almost complete, and the breakthrough and attach-

ment to the current building on floors one and three will then follow. The insulation board sheathing wrapping continues which will be followed by the application of the limestone façade to match the existing building. In the next couple of months the HVAC system will be installed.

With regard to the Michigan Street widening, until the project is complete in early 2018, expect additional lane restrictions during non-rush hour commute times, as

well as changes in pedestrian routes and street crossings. In addition, expect congestion at all intersections as new traffic control infrastructure and sidewalk ramps are installed. Bike lane construction will start soon.

Building entry remains a challenge for not only the IUSD family but for our patients as well. Please continue to assist patients as they try to find parking, make their way into the building and get to their appointment.

## Faculty Recruitment Update

This week IUSD is pleased to host candidate Dr. Tamara Button, who will be interviewing on May 5th for the position of assistant/associate professor in our Dental Public Health division of the Department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry & Dental Public Health. ## TB TEST REQUIREMENT DUE 6/10

It's that time of year to have your annual TB test completed and documented for compliance.
