- I. September minutes were approved with no changes
- II. Recent Events -
 - Steve reported the Women’s Advisory Board reception held in late August had low attendance the first night, Tuesday; but excellent attendance on the 2nd night, Wednesday. The time frame of 5:00 – 5:45 pm just before class works well for students. Todd suggested maybe holding a reception before one of the enterprise lectures would be a good idea.
 - Joint MBA Recruiting Event with Bloomington and Kelley Direct went well. Had great attendance from prospective students.
