 - Faculty excellence in teaching and research on the rise
 - The state of the budget information seems positive. However, the Chancellor wants all to know there are uncertainties, but, there might be another 6% cut. Kelley's appropriation from state budget is very small, any reductions will depend on money is cut.

 - He will still be on the payroll for another semester
- MBA
 - MBA applications (down 24%)– challenging year, extended the deadline but still not where we would like (confident both cohorts will be at max). The quality of students are higher. The average GMAT score is 625. Bloomington's applications are down 18-20%.
 - External Affairs will increase the marketing efforts for the MBA program. It is important for faculty to recruit. Evening MBA policy committee is looking at the curriculum. External Affairs will compare other Indianapolis MBA programs to focus on other students to see compare students compared to other programs
 - We need to make sure that what we are providing for the students is adequate. KSBI program is 33 months (taking two classes per semester). Other programs are less credit hours and do not take as long.
 - Time to graduation is 2.5 years, not three. Several students request to take additional credits to graduate early.
