Unless you are okay with drinking water from polluted aquifers, breathing air polluted with cancer-causing chemicals, fishing from waterways polluted by sewage and chemicals and/or having your kids/grandkids play in polluted soil that can damage their brains and health, you need to take personal responsibility by doing your part to prevent toxic substances from entering the environment. Prescription Drug Take Back Day April 30th

The IUPUI police are taking part in National Prescription Drug Take Back Day, by offering a drive-through, no-questions-asked drop-off of unwanted prescription (including injectables and liquids) and over-the-counter drugs at 1232. W. Michigan St. on Saturday, April 30th, 10-2:00. The Marion County Prosecutor's Office and the Drug Enforcement Administration will hold a similar event on Saturday, April 30th, 10 a.m.-2 p.m. at Pleasant View Lutheran Church, 801 W. 73rd Street. Drugs should not be flushed down the toilet because the drugs can end up in our streams, aquifers and drinking water -http://www.msnbc.msn.com/id/3077015/ns/health-health_care . Water treatment plant procedures do not generally remove drugs from the water you drink.

Toxic materials are extremely common in e-waste. Lead, for example, can be found in cathode ray tubes in many televisions and computer monitors. If improperly handled, e-waste can cause harm to the environment beyond the negative impact of adding clutter to landfills. Get rid of items such as computer systems and accessories, phones and handheld devices, audio and video equipment, and office electronics at the parking lot near 62nd and Rural (across from Glendale Mall) on May 14, 9-2:00. Opt Out of Mailings for Credit Card and Insurance Offers

You can opt out of receiving pre-screened credit card and insurance offers by calling 1-888-5OPTOUT (1-888-567-8688). Use a secure phone. They will ask for personal information like social security number, but if you hesitate it seems to honor your request to opt out without all the personal information (though this may not work if you have a very common name). You can choose to opt out for a limited amount of time or for good, so listen to all the options before choosing. This was checked out on Snopes to make sure it is legitimate - <http://www.snopes.com/inboxer/pending/credit.asp> .

Be an Informed Voter & Print Out Your Own Personalized Ballot

If you like to be an *informed* voter (see quote at top) AND want to make it easy for yourself, visit www.indystar.com/voterguide , enter your county, city/town, and indicate whether you want to see all candidates or just your party's primary candidates; read the Q & A section (Q/A #2 allows you to click on the town you live in, get a map of districts and click on the district to see an enlargement to determine your district, which you'll need to know as you go through the list;) return to top section and click the yellow "Submit" button. When the list of candidates comes up, click on the names of the candidates you want to compare and read their information, then use the back arrow to go back to main list of candidates and click on small box at top left of each candidate you've selected (this DOES take a bit of time, but being an informed voter is worth it). At bottom, click on "Create My Ballot" and at next page click "Print My Ballot," if you want to take to poll.

It is early in the season and I have no way of knowing if all the information at these sites is up to date, so I recommend you call before visiting. Eat local; support local growers.
