NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION WORKSHOP AT BUTLER UNIVERSITY:

On October 5, 2007, the National Science Foundation (NSF), Butler University, and the Indiana Economic Development Corporation will host a one-day workshop on the NSF proposal and merit review process and NSF programs that cut across disciplines. MANDATORY USE OF THE ELECTRONIC FINANCIAL STATUS REPORT SYSTEM NIH eRA COMMONS: Beginning October 1, 2007, NIH will require all Financial Status Reports (FSRs) (domestic and foreign) to be submitted using the electronic FSR system located in the eRA Commons. This includes all initial FSRs being prepared for submission and any revisions being submitted or re-submitted to NIH.

IDENTIFYING FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Several on-line search tools are available to IUPUI investigators who are interested in identifying funding opportunities in their areas of interest. Several are listed below:

Community of Science (COS): COS is a primary on-line search tool for identifying funding opportunities. To take advantage of this powerful tool, register at <http://www.cos.com/login/join.shtml>. Once you have completed the short registration process, you can personalize your search by selecting the option entitled "launch your workbench". You can access federal, local, corporate, foundation, nonprofit and other funding opportunities using key terms and save the results of up to 20 searches and have them delivered to you weekly via email.

National Institutes of Health (NIH) "NIH Guide": To take advantage of this search tool, register at <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/listserv.htm>. It allows you to receive discipline specific funding opportunities that are delivered to you weekly via email.

National Science Foundation (NSF) "MyNSF": To take advantage of this search tool, register at <http://www.nsf.gov/mynsf/>. It allows you to receive discipline specific funding opportunities that are delivered to you weekly via email.

Federal Business Opportunities "FedBizOpps": FedBizOpps is the single government point-of-entry for Federal government procurement opportunities over \$25,000. To take advantage of this search tool, visit

Opportunities found at this site include, but are not limited to, presolicitations and special notices for research and service contracts for specific projects and some national centers and surveys that would not be found in Grants.gov and may not be found in the Community of Science.

NATIONAL INSTITUTES OF HEALTH

Developmental Mechanisms of Human Structural Birth Defects (P01):

Focus is on innovative, multidisciplinary, interactive, and synergistic projects that integrate basic, translational, and clinical approaches to understanding the developmental biology and genetic basis of congenital human malformations. Standard application dates apply. <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PA-07-419.html>

Developmental Pharmacology (R01): Focus is on multidisciplinary, investigator-initiated basic and translational research in developmental pharmacology with particular emphasis on the role of ontogeny on drug metabolizing enzymes, transporters, receptors and signaling pathways activity across developmental periods from fetal life to adolescence. Application deadline is September 22, January 22 and May 22.

Exceptional, Unconventional Research Enabling Knowledge Acceleration (EUREKA) (R01):

Focus is on exceptionally innovative research on novel hypotheses or difficult problems. Results are expected to have an extremely

high impact in biomedical or biobehavioral research. Application deadline is October 24. <http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/rfa-files/RFA-GM-08-002.html>

Genetic Epidemiology of Substance Use Disorders (R01, R03, R21): Focus is on expanding the application of genetic epidemiologic methods to studies of substance and alcohol use disorders (SUDs/AUD, drug and alcohol abuse and dependence). Health Promotion Among Racial and Ethnic Minority Males (R01, R21): Focus is on enhancing understanding of the numerous factors influencing the health promoting behaviors of minority males and developing and testing health-promoting interventions designed to reduce health disparities. Health Research with Diverse Populations (R01, R03, R15, R21): Focus is on biological, behavioral, social, addictive, and mental health research related to the health of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, and other diverse populations.
