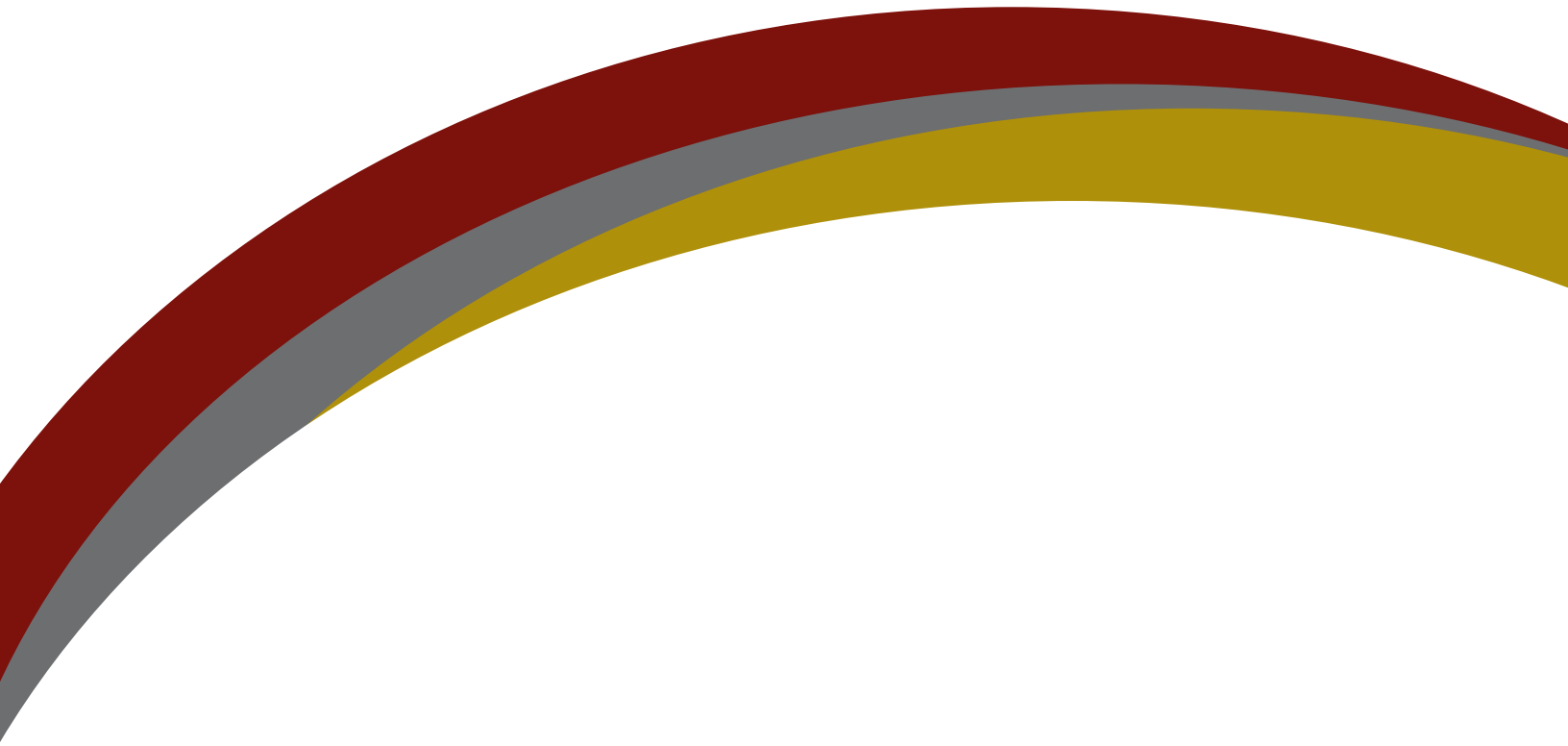

Service Learning Courses*

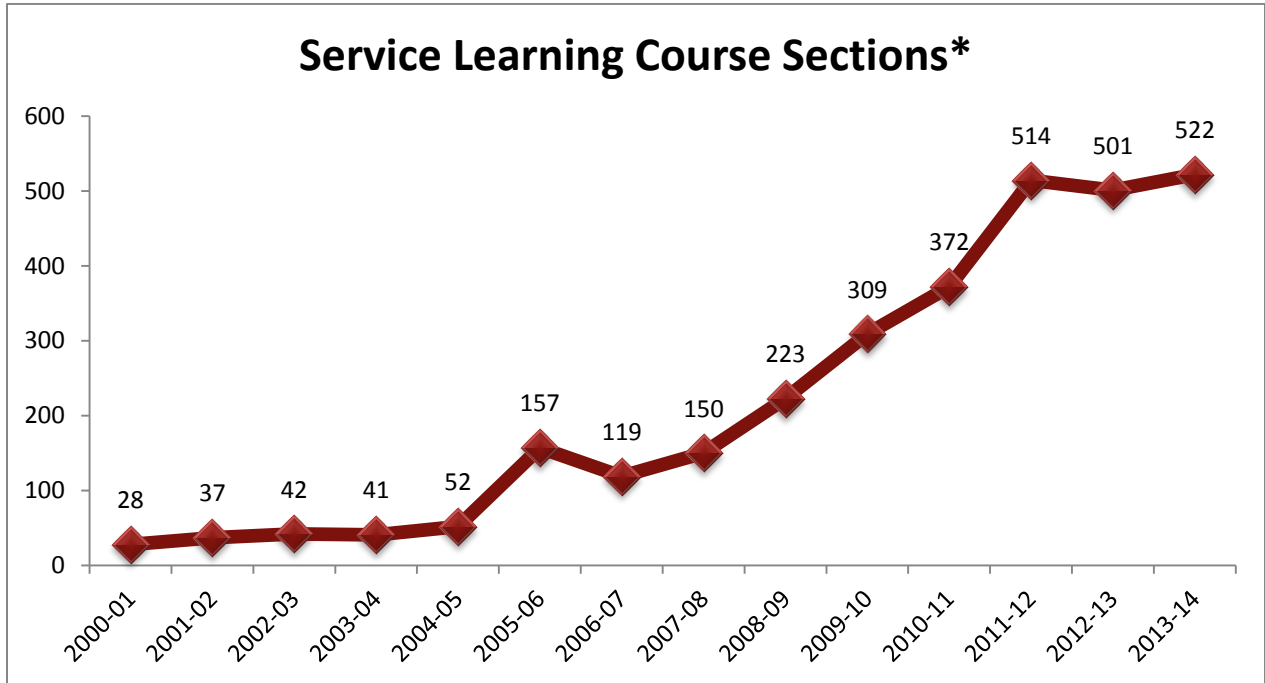


Figure 1.1 illustrates the trend of the number of service learning course sections offered at IUPUI.

IUPUI maintains a strong campus commitment to the community through curricular engagement. As is represented in Figure 1.1, IUPUI continues to offer a significant number of service learning courses* as represented by a 4% increase compared to 2012-2013.

**Service learning course section represents a course that contains a service component or where students “spend a significant amount of time in a community setting”. Oftentimes, this is a “S” course, but in some cases, the course may have a different R.I.S.E. or Experiential Learning notation according to the registrar’s data. For this reason, CSL contacts all instructors of record meeting our initial search criteria to verify whether or not the course should be included in the data set. In addition, if there are multiple sections of a course, each section is counted as a “course”.*



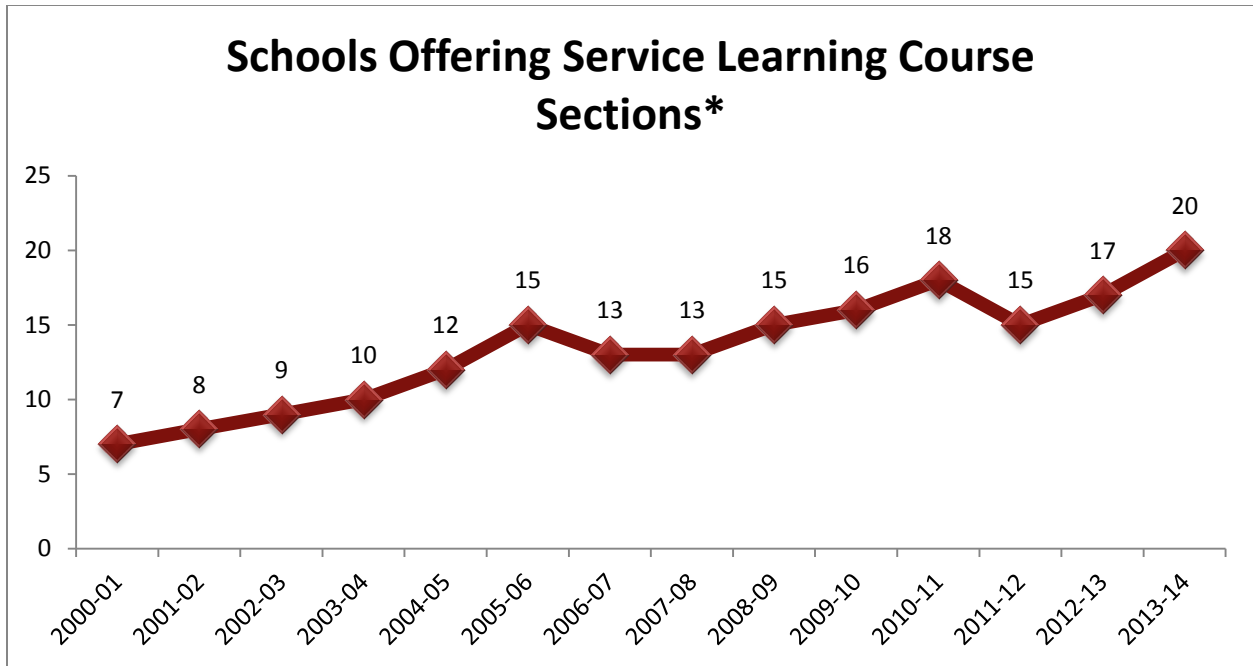


Figure 1.2 portrays the trend of the number of schools offering service learning courses.

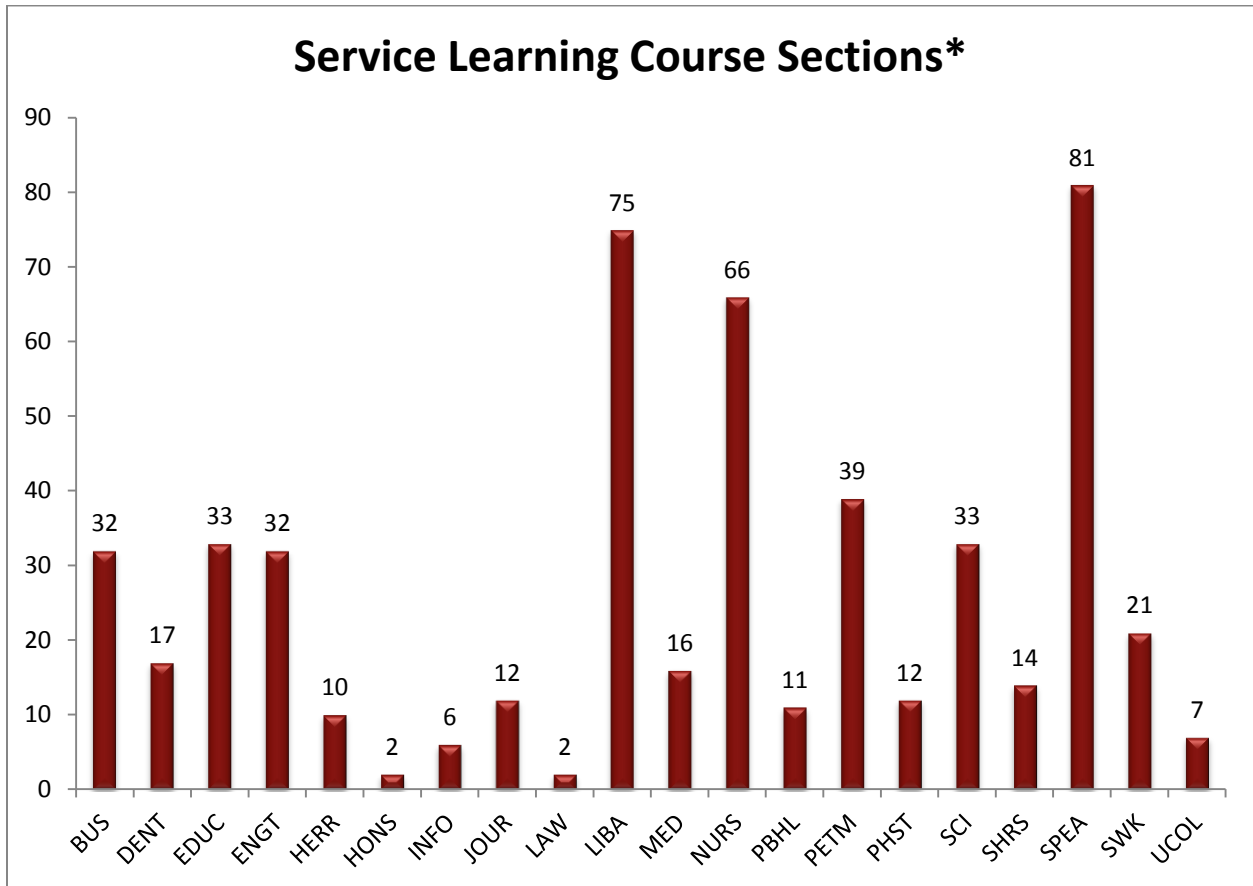


Figure 1.3 depicts the number of service learning courses offered by school. Note: Schools not offering any service learning courses according to the Registrar's Office were omitted.

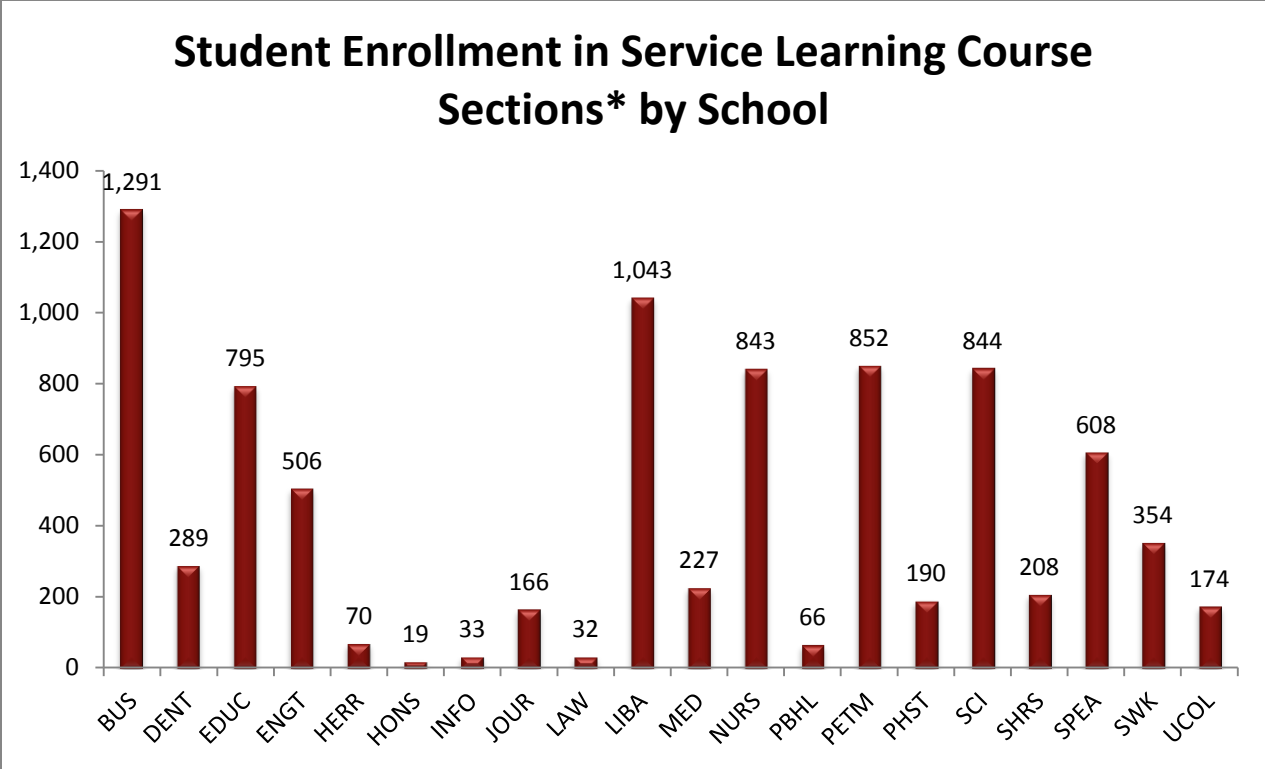


Figure 1.4 illustrates the number of students enrolled in a service learning course section by school.

Table 1.1 illustrates the average number of service hours students in a 100, 200, 300, 400, and graduate level course contributed. The significantly higher average at the 300 and 400-level is likely due to internships, independent study, clinical, and capstone experiences.

Service Hours

The following figure illustrates the number of hours students at IUPUI contributed to the community as part of a service learning course section. There was a reported increase of 11% over the previous year. Some of the increase may be attributed to the enhancements made to the online database used to verify courses making it easier to obtain more complete information from the faculty.

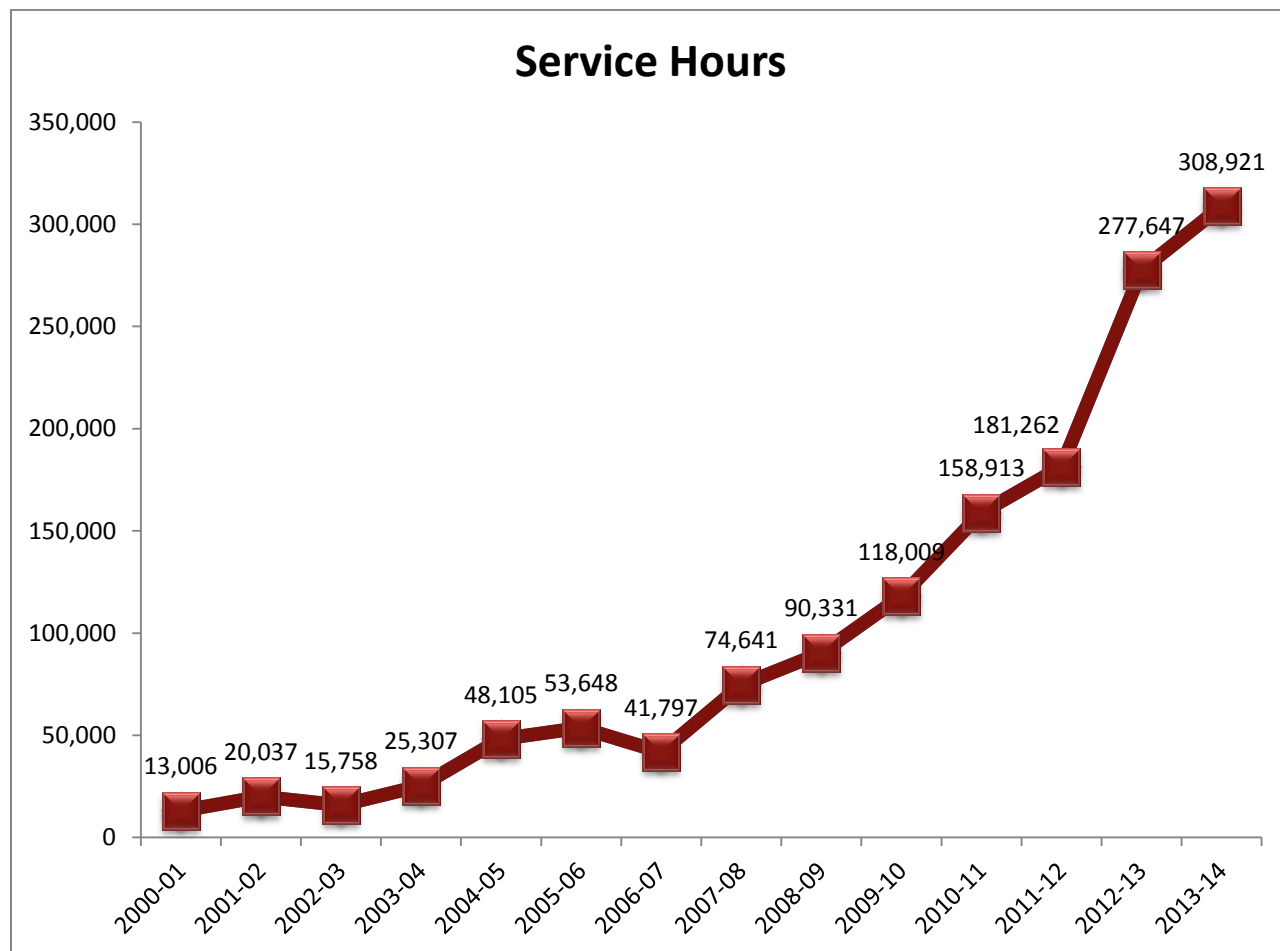


Figure 2.1 illustrates the trend of service hours IUPUI students enrolled in a service learning course contributed to the community from the 2000-2001 academic year to date.



Service Hours by School

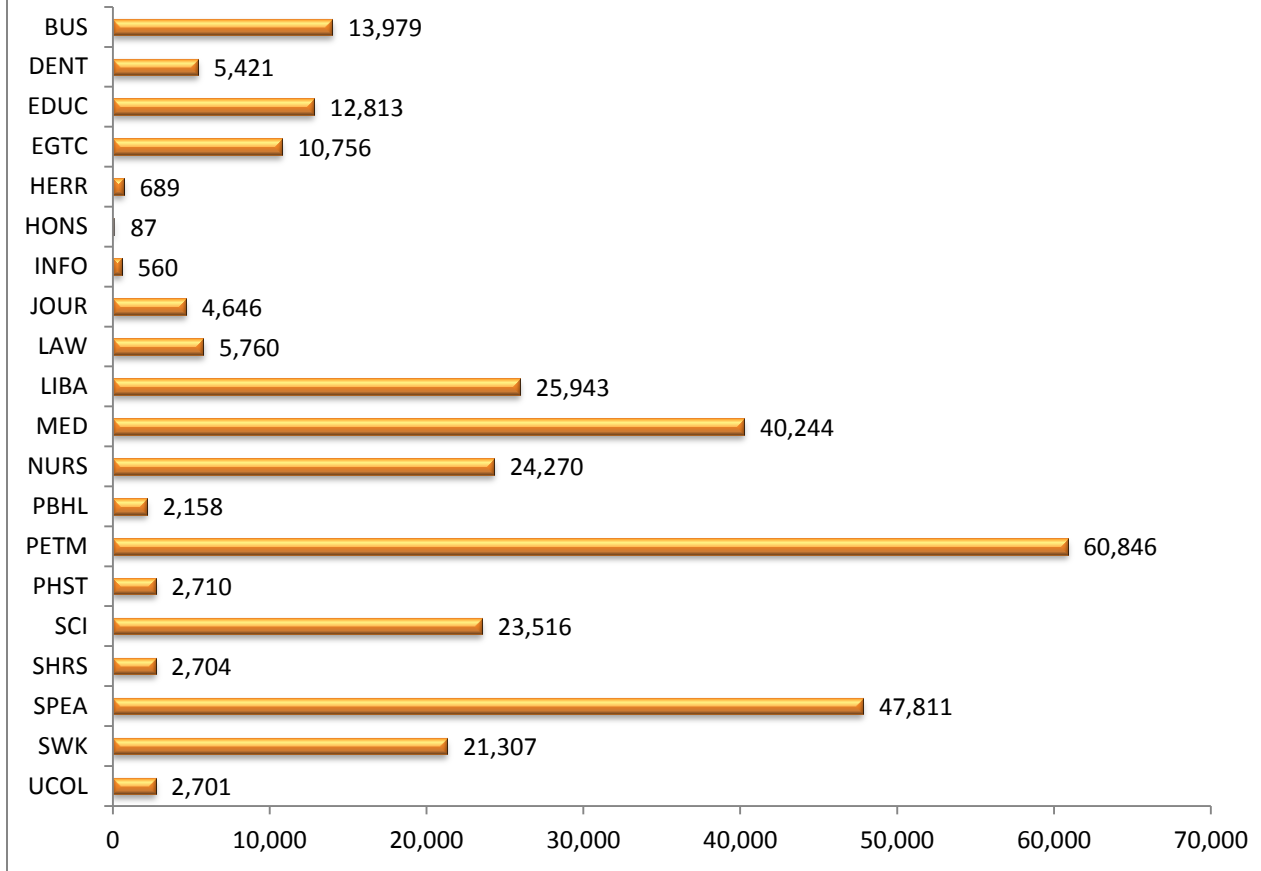


Figure 2.2 illustrates the number of service hours IUPUI students contributed to the community through a service learning course by school during the 2013-2014 academic year.



Economic Impact of Service

IUPUI students enrolled in a course containing a service component contributed an estimated equivalent of **\$12.9 million** to the community. This represents a 42% increase when compared to last year. The Value of Volunteer Time according to the Independent Sector is \$22.14 per hour. This was used to calculate the economic impact of undergraduate courses. Graduate courses were calculated using the Pro Bono Standards Rate and varied across disciplines.

Table 2.1 illustrates the economic impact of the service hours contributed by students from each school through course-based activities in the community.

Student Enrollment

There was a 10% increase reported in the number of students enrolled in a service learning course during the 2013-2014 academic year. Also worth noting is an enhanced ability to account for participation in service in a course where service was 'optional'. Our findings indicate that when service is 'optional', 86% of students enrolled actually participate in service.

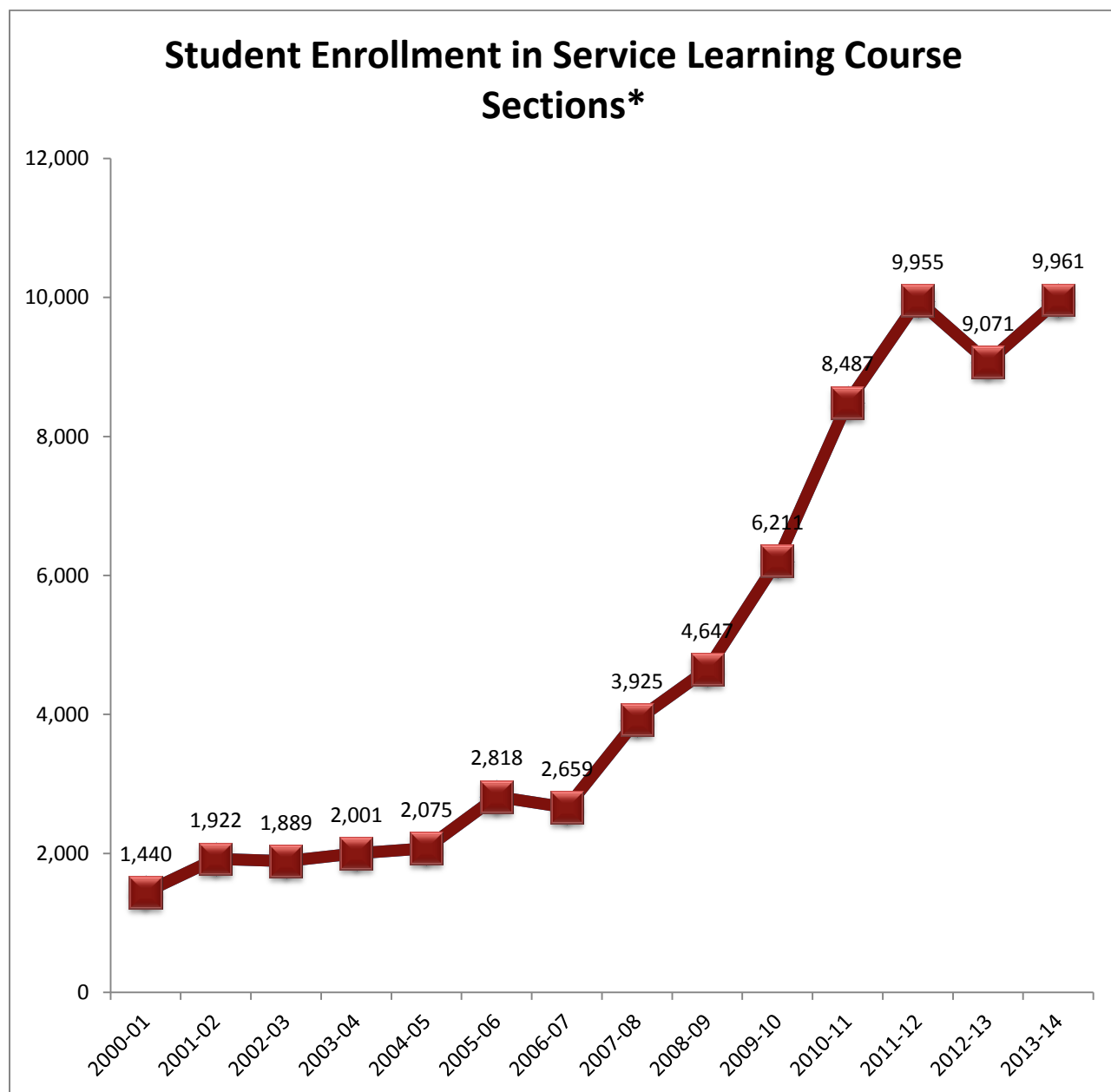


Figure 3.1 illustrates the trend of student enrollment in service through a service learning course.

Undergraduates & Graduates that Participated in Service Learning by School

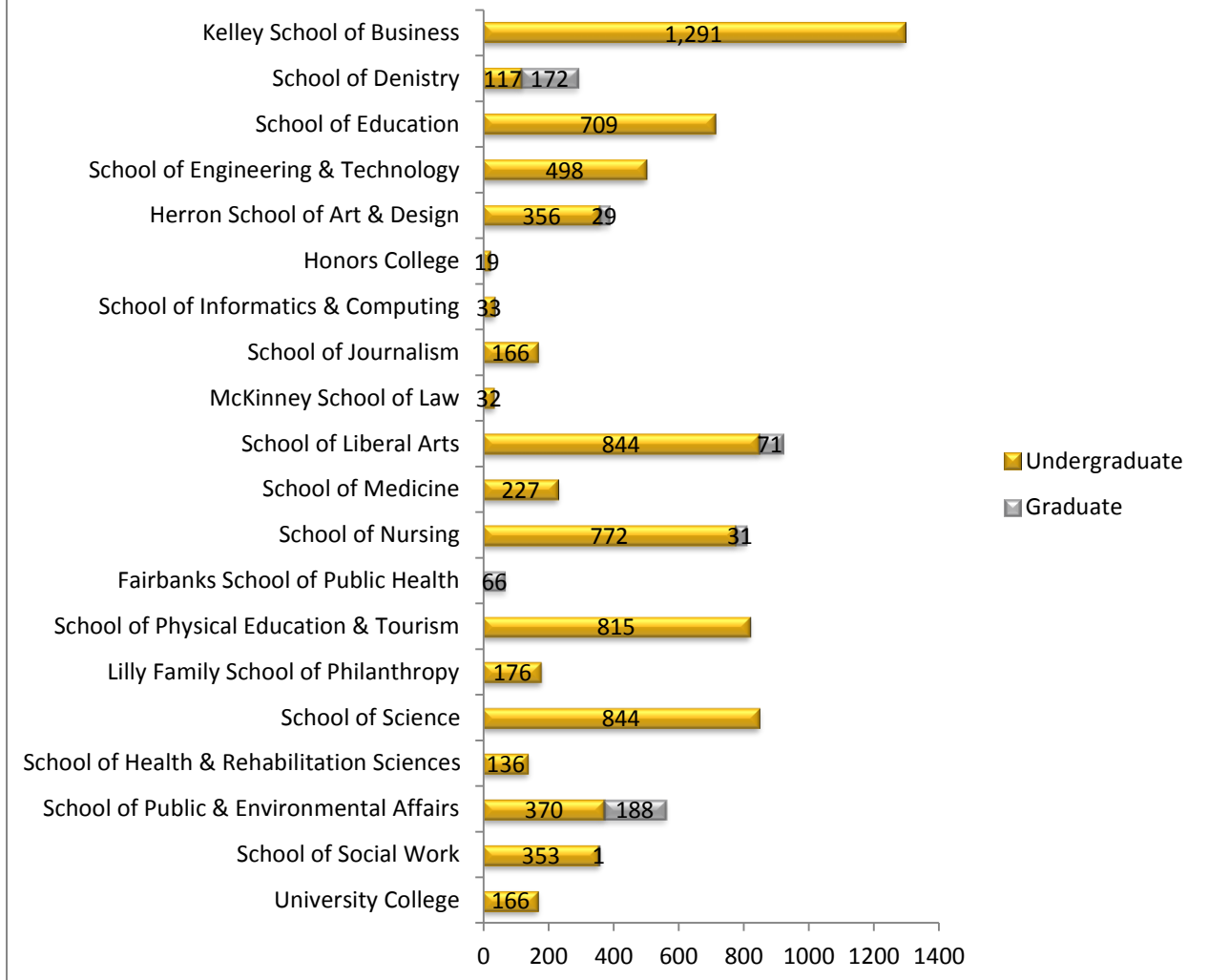


Figure 3.2 shows the number of undergraduate and graduate students enrolled, by school, in a service learning course for the 2013-2014 academic year.

A total of 33 students (20 undergraduate and 13 graduate) received the William M. Plater Civic Engagement Medallion.

Service Learning Faculty

There was a 10% increase in the reported number of faculty teaching service learning course.

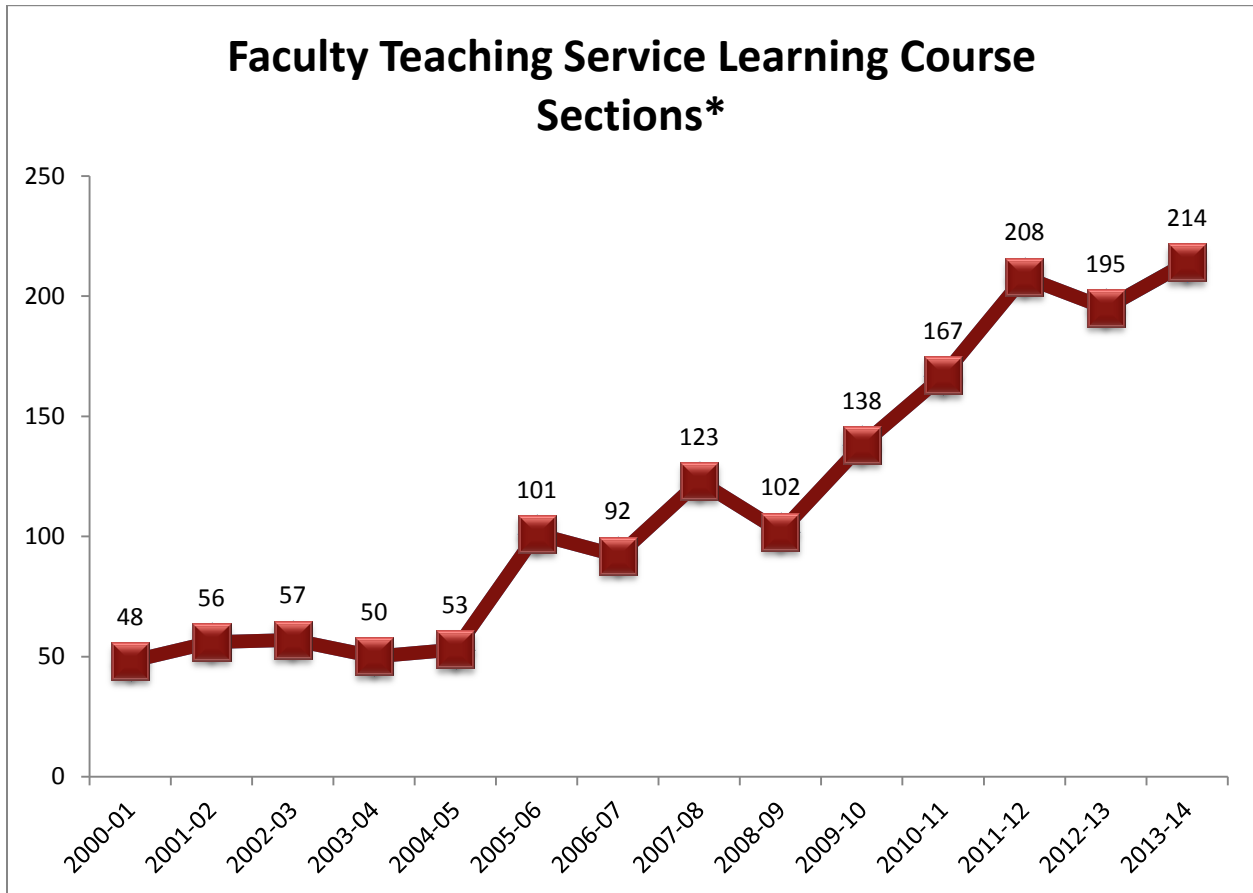


Figure 4.1 illustrates the trend of the number of faculty teaching service learning courses. Note: 'Faculty' represents the instructor of record, which includes a variety of roles including graduate assistants and those in primarily staff roles.



Faculty Development Grantees

The CSL staff offers workshops, individual consultations, and assistance to faculty and staff to support community-engaged teaching, research, or service. In addition, faculty development funding supports faculty in creating or enhancing an existing service learning course (i.e., Service Learning Course Development Grant) and to disseminate findings from research or assessment of their community-engaged work. The faculty who received funds are listed in Table 4.1.

Service Learning Assistant Program

The Service Learning Assistant (SLA) program is designed to support community-engaged faculty teaching, research, and service. Faculty and staff have the opportunity to apply for these competitive funds each semester. SLAs may assist their faculty/staff mentors with:

- Designing and implementing of a service learning class
- Conducting a community-engaged research project
- Supporting capacity building for the expansion of service learning within a campus department or unit
- Implementing a professional service project in and with the community

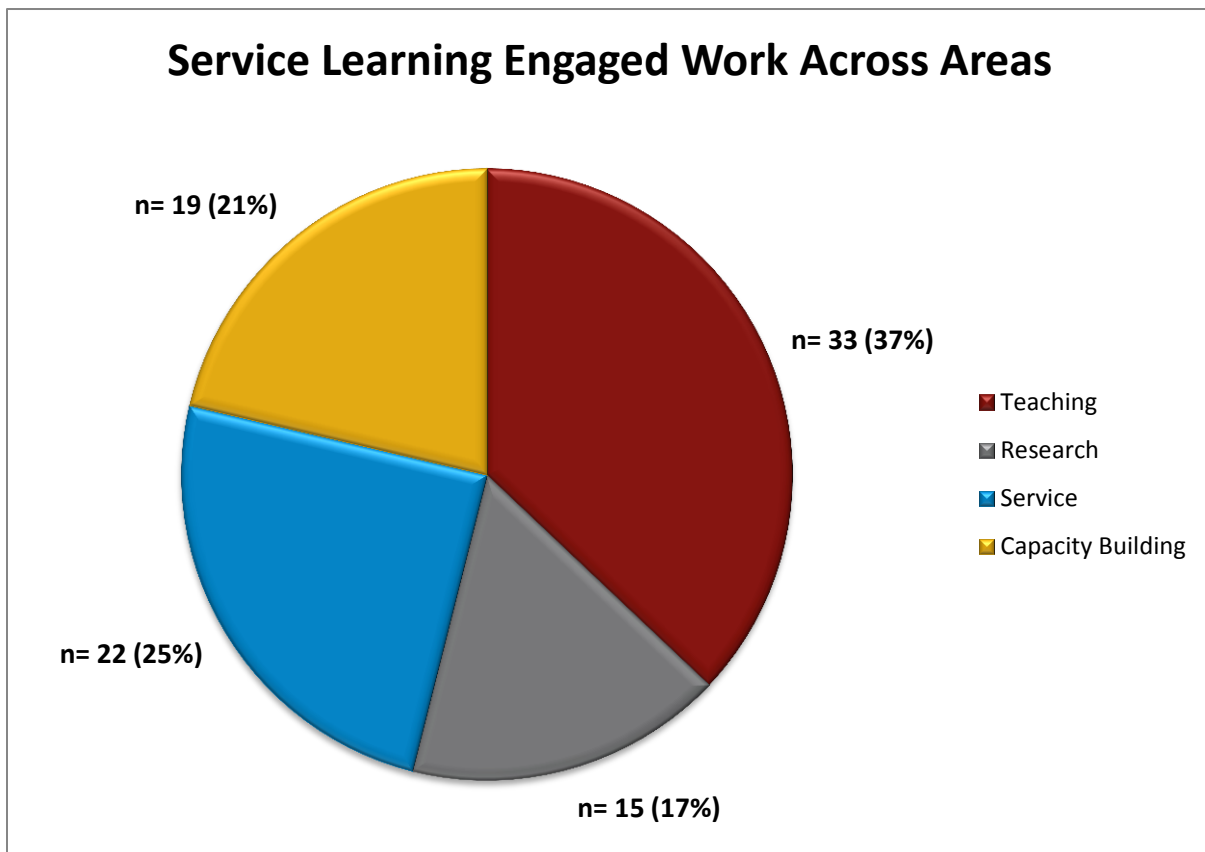


Figure 4.2 illustrates faculty/staff self-reported usage of Service Learning Assistant funding.

The SLA program supported 68 faculty and staff, which equated to \$242,625 in awards to 107 students. The number of faculty and staff receiving these funds represents a 21% increase from the previous year. Figure 4.2 illustrates how faculty are using these funds and have integrated their community-engaged work across teaching, research, and service.

Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholars

The CSL awards *Commitment to Excellence* scholarship funds to recognize students for service as a form of merit. The scholarship program was named after Sam H. Jones, a dedicated public servant, advocate of social change, and Chief Executive Officer of the Indianapolis Urban League for 36 years. Nearly 225 Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholars participated in one of nine different programs. This co-curricular program has received national attention for developing civic-minded graduates and is critical to IUPUI's ability to offer educationally meaningful community-engaged opportunities to students.

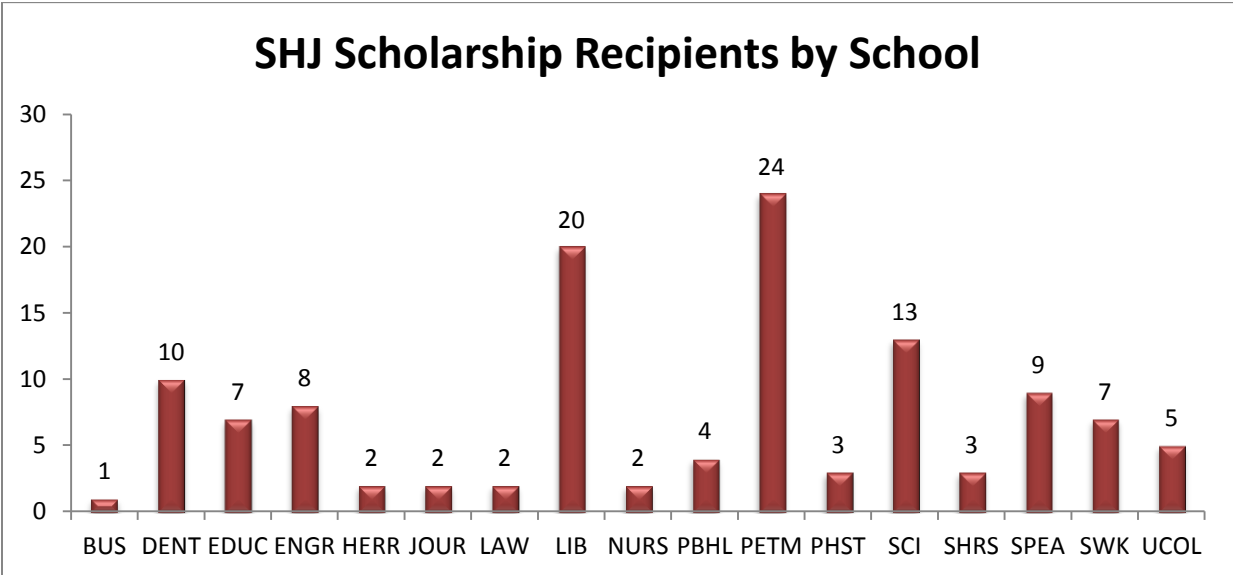


Figure 5.1 indicates the number of Sam H. Jones scholars and the school in which they were enrolled for the 2013-2014 academic year.

Service learning course instructors reported a combined total of 436 community partners, a 33% increase from the previous year.

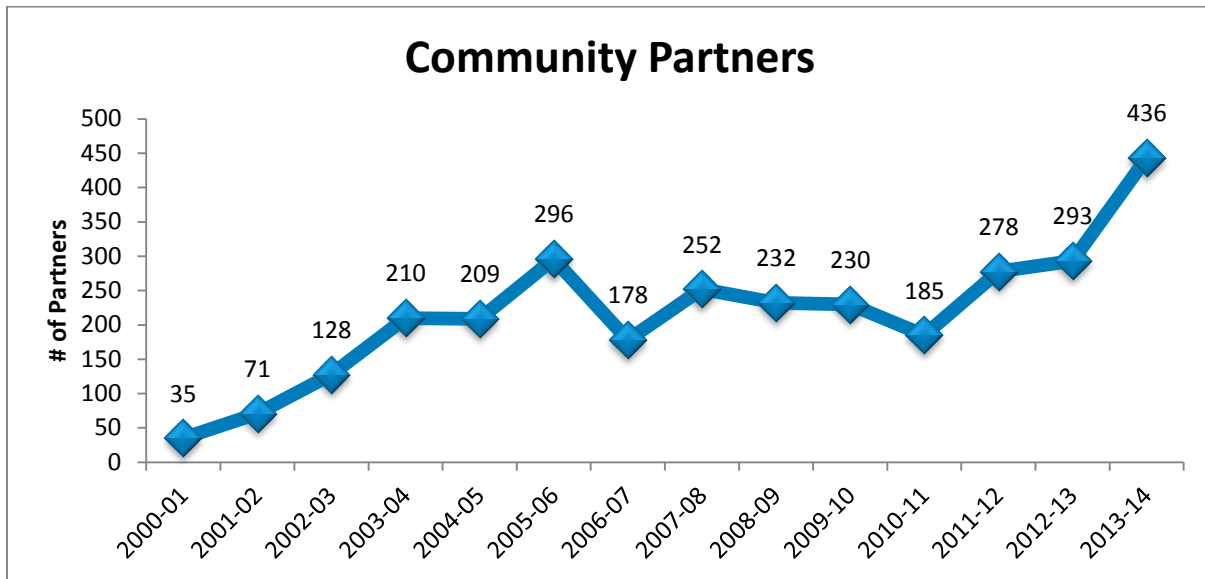


Figure 6.1 exhibits the trend of the number of community partners associated with a service learning course since 2000-2001.
