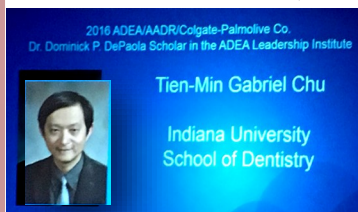

From the Desk of the EAD/ADFA



The month of March seems to have arrived and departed in a whirlwind of activity. Many, of course, attended and participated in either or both the American Dental Education Association (ADEA) annual session in Denver and American Association for Dental Research (AADR) annual meeting in Los Angeles.

IUSD is well-represented in the activity and organization of both associations, and some colleagues were elected to hold office for the first time. Dr. Gabe Chu received a prestigious award from ADEA, the



2016 ADEA/AADR/Colgate-Palmolive Company [Dr. Dominick P. DePaola Scholar](#) in the ADEA Leadership Institute. Other faculty recognitions and officer positions are detailed on later pages in this newsletter. We congratulate them all, and for the service they provide to our profession and the academy, on behalf of the school.

For me, the highlights were at ADEA, with the captivating plenary presentation by Alison Levine, in which she used the

experience of her Everest expeditions as a metaphor for achievement and leadership. The conversation between Howard Dean and Karl Rove understandably focused on current excitement and controversy in the jousting between putative presidential candidates.

One statement during the discussion with these two DC veterans rang true for me, and found an echo in our own school governance. Both made the point that voting as a citizen is not simply a *right*, but should be seen as an *obligation*, within a functioning democracy. If you do not participate, you have no right to complain about the outcome. The reality is that, in most advanced democracies, achieving a 50% turnout of eligible voters can be a challenge.

I was reminded of a recent electronic poll here at IUSD, requiring a vote on a simple change to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Faculty Council. When Frank Lippert, as secretary, posted the outcome, it was 12 votes in favor, 1 opposed, and a note that 61 eligible faculty voters had not taken the 10-15 seconds required to vote at all. A turnout of 19%.

To be fair, the participation is better at times.

Periodically I refer to the campus Mentoring Academy and our project that focuses on Department Chairs. Under the excellent stewardship of Paul Edwards, we are now in serious discussion with Danielle Calvert from CAITS who will help create the website devoted to the program. Gabe Chu is helping us by providing input with specific reference to research-focused faculty. Many of you will have seen March's issue of the *Journal of Dental Education*. There are two interesting articles that report on chair mentoring and a succinct editorial on the subject by Michael Reddy, Dean at The University of Alabama in Birmingham. I had the opportunity to talk to him about it in Denver, and it seems that our program is attracting some interest. Of course, we have yet to show results. But that is for the future.

April will be equally busy with many school-level activities from the completion of the annual reviews on the 1st to Research Day on the 11th and to the many "end of semester activities" necessary to bring the academic year to a close and to prepare students for graduation in May.

Ortho Accolades

Department of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics faculty members, Dr. Ahmed Ghoneima, Assistant Professor, Director of the 3D Imaging Lab and Dr. Achint Utreja, Assistant Professor, Director of the Pre-doctoral Orthodontic Program, have recently been recognized by orthodontic organizations.

Dr. Ghoneima participated in the 43rd Annual Moyers Symposium held in Ann Arbor, Michigan from March 5-6, 2016. The Moyers Symposium is an annual research forum which focuses on the discipline of Orthodontics. Dr. Ghoneima received first place in the poster

competition for his research on sleep apnea. In addition to the aforementioned recognition, Dr. Ghoneima received notification last month from the [American Board of Orthodontics](#) (ABO) that he passed his board examination and has achieved diplomate status as a Board Certified Orthodontist. Although it is not widely known, only one in three orthodontists is board certified which is indicative of the significance of this profes-



sional achievement.

Early last month, Dr. Achint Utreja was awarded funding by the

[American Association of Orthodontists Foundation](#) (AAOF) for his 2016 Biomedical Research application, *The Effect*



of Intermittent PTH on Mandibular Condylar Cartilage. The AAOF award totals nearly \$30,000.

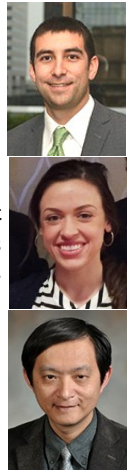

AADR Meeting Highlights



This year's American Association for Dental Research (AADR) Annual Meeting was held in Los Angeles, California, and took place from March 16-19. The AADR is a non-profit organization with more than 3,700 members in the United States. Its mission is to advance research and increase knowledge for the improvement of oral health; to support and represent the oral health research community; and to facilitate the communication and application of research findings. The AADR is the largest Division of the International Association for Dental Research (IADR).

This year's meeting was attended by several IUSD faculty and students, many of whom delivered symposia, oral sessions and/or poster presentations.

There were three faculty who presented a symposium, which included: Dr. Gerardo Maupome, *Network Features in a Latino Community in the Midwest*; Dr. Jeffrey Platt, *Clinical Practice Guidelines for Recall and Maintenance of Patients with Tooth-borne and Implant-borne Dental Restorations*; and Dr. Marco

Bottino, *Three-dimensional Antibiotic-incorporated Scaffolds for Root Canal Disinfection*.

Gerardo Maupome also was an organizer for a symposium, *Improving Health through Social Network Analysis, a Systems Science Method*, which took place on March 17.

Several other faculty presented co-authored papers during oral sessions. Those presenters were Dr. Gerardo Maupome, *Immigrant Dental Insurance, Pain, Visits Moderated by Networks and Acculturation*; Dr. Tien-Min Gabriel Chu, *Proliferation and Differentiation of Stem Cells Co-Cultured with Megakaryocytes*; Dr. Masatoshi Ando, *Geometry of White-spot Lesions by Fluorescence and Micro-CT Images*; and Dr. Marco Bottino, *Synthesis. Characterization and Matrix Metalloproteinase Inhibition of Doxycycline-Encapsulated-Nanotube-Modified Adhesives*.

There were also several IUSD students who presented oral sessions. These papers were co-authored by IUSD faculty, including: Dr. Tien-Min Gabriel Chu, Dr. Achint Utreja, Dr. Gerardo Maupome, Dr. Richard Gregory, and Dr. Marco Bottino. Along with oral sessions, there were many poster presentation delivered by faculty and both pre-doctoral and graduate students mentored by IUSD faculty members. Some of the primary mentors of these projects included: Drs. Tien-Min Gabriel Chu, Marco

Bottino, Jeffrey Platt, Thankam Thyvalikakath, Richard Gregory, Gerardo Maupome, Ghaeth Yassen, and Achint Utreja. In total, twenty-four presentations with IUSD affiliations were given.

During the meeting, Dean Williams hosted a celebratory dinner for the participating pre-doctoral and graduate students along with Dr. Angela Bruzzaniti, Director of Stu-



dent Research, Dr. Richard Gregory, Associate Dean for Graduate Education and Dr. Gabriel Chu, Associate Dean for Research.

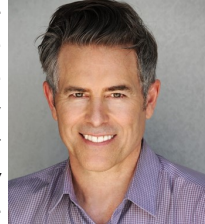
Center for Research and Learning. Faculty research poster presentations highlight the groundbreaking research conducted on the IUPUI campus.

A "use" is defined as someone either clicking for full-text or exporting the article to a citation manager database. Ask the library if you have questions.

Associate Dean Search Update

The Indiana University School of Dentistry's search process for an Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs is still underway. You may be aware that this is an open search, meaning both internal and external applicants can apply. The School was privileged to have interviewed internal candidate Dr. Harvey Weingarten recently.
