Community efforts for fluoridation are presently underway in several key communities in Indiana. These include Lawrence, Speedway, New Albany and Lawrenceburg. Brookston recently began fluoridating its water supply and the first fluoridation referendum in Indiana in several years occurred at Aurora where the citizens voted "yes" to adding fluoride to the water. Presently in Indiana among those people served by a community water supply, about 70 percent are drinking water containing the optimal amount of fluoride. The list of communities instituting this important health measure is growing steadily.
