COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP | EMERGENCY FUND FOR FLOOD VICTIMS

rising to the

Nearly a year after Johnson County was ravaged by flooding – the worst since 1913 – losses still sting.

But spirits are anything but soggy.

When the newly stocked food pantry and phone system, every single file and all office equipment were washed away at Human Services, Debbie DeBord, executive director, said she and her staff had no idea what to do.

On a shoe string budget, the agency provided a food pantry which served more than 5,000 Johnson County residents. They also assisted the community with emergency shelter, transportation, utility bills and medications.

In the midst of a crisis which left many residents homeless and many agencies displaced, community need was greater than ever before.

But Human Services was literally underwater.

“We were suddenly on the other side of things, needing the help ourselves,” DeBord said.

A block away, Tammi Hickman, director of Johnson County CASA, also saw nothing but need.

Hickman’s office, which advocates for more than 130 abused and neglected children, was also a total loss. All office equipment, 12 filing cabinets and 20 years of case histories floated in the dirty water.

“I cried over those lost files more than anything,” Hickman said. “They were a wealth of information when the cases were open. We kept all of our files until the children turned 18.”

United Way of Johnson County lost school supplies earmarked for 350 area students.

Stunned and overwhelmed, directors of other nonprofit agencies, such as Youth Connections and Purdue Extension office found themselves at a standstill.

Their agencies were water-logged. Their budgets were too tight to replace lost supplies.

One nonprofit program miraculously suffered limited damage. The Johnson County Community Foundation discovered a flooded basement and a lost hot water heater.

Foundation staff stopped sloshing through their own clean-up to answer the first call for help.

Two days after the flood, Kim Minton, director of grants and scholarships for the foundation, wrote an emergency grant for Johnson County Veterans Services director, Russ Benshemeir, to replace a lost laptop computer.

When the foundation provided a grant for \$10,000, Human Services staff scrambled into action.

They relocated temporarily and opened a makeshift office to field emergency calls.

A grant for \$7,768.00 made it possible for Hickman to relocate to the law library at the Johnson County Courthouse. She also replaced brochures and badly needed materials to educate and draw in volunteers.

"To just have to start all over from scratch was overwhelming," Hickman said. "We just had to try to pick up where we left off."

Within a two-week period, the Johnson County Community Foundation served as a much needed island in the midst of crisis.

Working quickly, the foundation provided \$30,661 in emergency grants to hard-hit nonprofit agencies, Minton said.

"It was a relief to know that the Johnson County Community Foundation had designated dollars put aside for emergencies," Minton said.

"With help from the foundation, area agencies and organizations that were devastated were able to get back to everyday business."

The foundation provided the only immediate life preserver available to Human Services, Debord said.

"The timing of the grant helped us put the food back in our pantry," Debord said. "We couldn't have done any of it without the foundation. That grant money was the only money we could depend on to replace those losses."

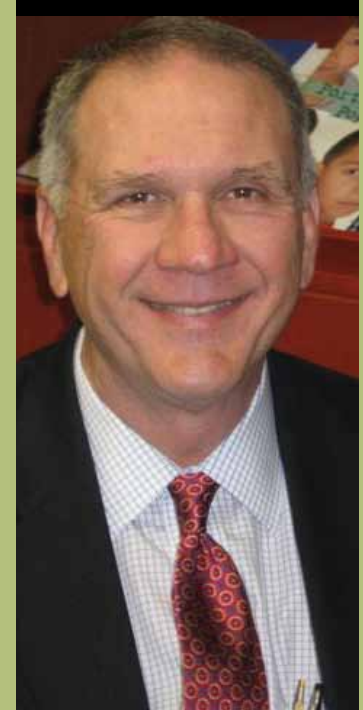

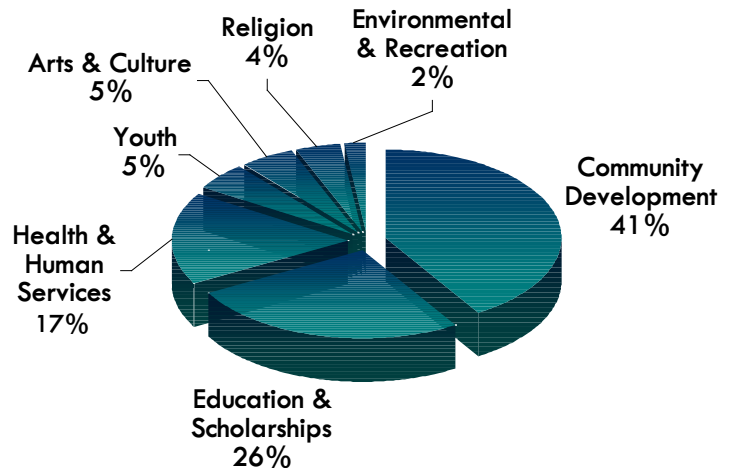

how to apply

We encourage contact between grant seekers and foundation staff before, during and after the proposal review process. We provide applicants with general advice about our process and funding priorities. Grant seekers must use our grant application. There are established annual grant cycles. However, we are responsive to emergency needs or time sensitive opportunities, so contact us at any time.

To be eligible, an organization must qualify under the regulations of the U.S. Treasury codes as a nonprofit. The community foundation works to further charitable projects in compliance with these regulations, as well as in compliance with non-discrimination practices.

Nonprofits may make a letter of inquiry that contains a brief statement of needs and enough information about the project for us to determine if a formal application is necessary. If so, we will provide you with an application and comprehensive guidelines. You may also obtain additional information regarding our grant guidelines by visiting our website at www.jccf.org.

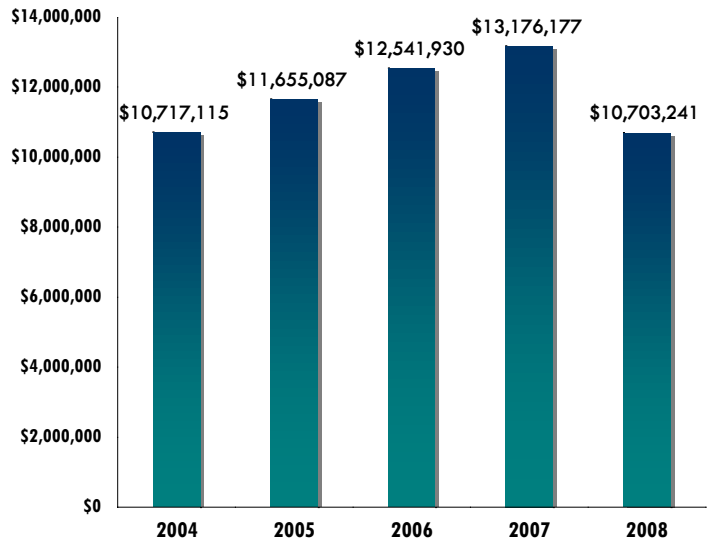

Investment update

2008 will certainly go down in history as being one of, if not the most, challenging investment periods in our country's history. Moreover, it is one of the most difficult times ever faced

from a global perspective. Virtually every financial asset class, with the exception of treasury bonds, declined significantly. Even conservative investors, such as JCCF, suffered losses in this environment.

The Johnson County Community Foundation assets are invested using a multi-manager, multi-style approach with several different benchmarks to evaluate performance. Assets for the 2008 fiscal year declined 24.1%. While disheartened by the loss, we are also buoyed to know that (according to the Council on Foundations) other foundations around the country realized an average decline of 28%.

We all understand what this means for individuals when their personal savings accounts decline – less income, cutting expenses, making sacrifices and working harder. For JCCF, it's much the same, except the whole community feels our loss. We currently have much less to give in grants and scholarships; therefore, we will focus on the greatest needs. We are operating on an even tighter budget and rely on a small and competent staff and an army of volunteers. We are prioritizing our services and expenses. And, we are working to identify specific needs of our nonprofit colleagues to meet their needs in these special times.

One of our strategies has focused on an in-depth analysis of our investment process. Over the past few months, we have reviewed all of our managers, fee structures, and processes to insure that we achieve our goal of being the best fiduciary steward of our donors' funds in the most efficient, effective and prudent manner. While none of us know when a lasting economic recovery will occur, your community foundation will be in a well-planned position to maximize our recovery.

Since 2000 JCCF has partnered closely with Franklin College to provide two successful programs to the county and beyond.

CAPE: Through a grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to both the college and JCCF, the Community Alliance to Promote Education (CAPE) was brought to Johnson County.
