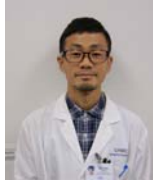
# Recruitment Update

New among IU School of Dentistry's short list of posted vacant positions is a posting to fill two faculty positions within the department of Comprehensive Care & General Dentistry. Both positions are for the rank of either clinical assistant professor or clinical associate professor. This search, however, is open to current faculty only. That restriction for this search better positions the department and school as we continue preparing not just for patient care in the James J. Fritts, DDS Clinical Care Center, but also as we begin this summer to prepare for accreditation through the Commission on Dental Accreditation. May 18 is the deadline for internal candidates to [apply](#).

Last month the Division of Radiology in the department of Oral Pathology, Medicine & Radiology reposted its [position](#) of clinical assistant/associate professor in Oral & Maxillofacial Radiology. The anticipated start date is on or

before January 1, 2019.

Our department of Biomedical & Applied Sciences is pleased to have Dr. Mizuho Kittaka start with the school on June 1, 2018. Dr. Kittaka, a postdoctoral research fellow, is part of the research team supporting Dr. Yasuyoshi Ueki, who will be starting with IUSD this summer. This early arrival for Dr. Kittaka allows time for Dr. Kittaka to setup Dr. Ueki's lab and address other preparatory duties to ensure a smooth transition for Dr. Ueki's research that includes research on a mechanism of bone resorption in periodontitis. Once Dr. Ueki arrives, Dr. Kittaka will continue contributing to the maintenance of Dr. Ueki's lab. Additionally, he will generate manuscripts for publication in scientific journals, present papers at scientific meetings, and assist in the development of research grant applications. Drs. Kittaka and Ueki



are coming from the University of Missouri—Kansas City, School of Dentistry.

In April, Dr. Simone Duarte recruited to the department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry & Dental Public Health Dr. Beatriz Panariello. Dr. Panariello, a graduate of São Paulo State University School of Dentistry (DDS, 2010; MSc, 2013; PhD, 2017) will begin her appointment on June 1, 2018, as a postdoctoral research fellow under the mentorship of Dr. Duarte. As a postdoctoral research fellow, she will conduct research independently and support Dr. Duarte's ongoing research projects, particularly in the area of oral biofilms. Dr. Panariello also will train students and participate in analyzing research data, writing grants and manuscripts. Thank you for your precious commitment to make IUSD a culture where faculty inspire, and welcome to our new colleagues!

# What Has CAITS Done Lately?

Unsung heroes surround us everyday, sometimes taking the welcoming form of an information technology employee. For the IU School of Dentistry, that would be a member of our Clinical Affairs Technology Services (CAITS) team—a member who rescues an infected laptop from being ravaged by a virus, or who by restoring a malfunctioning system saves a classroom lecture or formal presentation from near disaster, or who enables us to breathe easier because of an in-office visit that kept a project or paper moving forward in time to meet a time sensitive

deadline.

From last May to last August, in each of those months CAITS received more than 2,200 requests. In August 2017 alone CAITS received more than 2,544 requests, breaking a single month record! In fact, CAITS in 2017 handled at least 24,124 help requests, another record number and up 3,000 requests from 2016, with 14,431 of those 24,124 coming from emails sent to CAITS' ticket tracking system.

Despite those numbers and because of helpful feedback you provided through vari-

ous surveys, CAITS—perhaps miraculously—over the past three years has reduced the average number of days taken to close a support request. In 2014 it took an average of 10.56 days for a close. By the end of 2017 that number was down to 6.49.

An analysis showed that nearly 50% of CAITS requests fall within the following four categories (in order of frequency): software troubleshooting, end user training, operating system support, and server engineering/modification of shared folder permissions. Our unsung heroes are rescuing us everyday.

# New Asst. Vice Chancellor for FA



IUPUI Senior Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs Margie Ferguson has announced the appointment of Rachel Applegate as assistant vice chancellor for faculty affairs.

Applegate has served on the IUPUI Faculty Council since 2004 and is concluding her two-year term as the council's president. Throughout her tenure with Indiana University and IUPUI, Applegate has served on numerous committees working with faculty policy, budgetary affairs, promotion and tenure, academic policies and procedures, and many others.

Applegate will provide strategic leadership with responsibilities in five primary domains related to the work and success of all faculty and librarians: professional development, promotion and tenure, faculty records, leaves, and titles. Some of her areas of responsibility will include professional development programming, the promotion and tenure process, and the review of hiring and retention practices in collaboration with school leadership. This role will also partner with the associate vice chancellor for faculty diversity and inclusion to coordinate recruitment and retention efforts.

Her new appointment will begin full-time May 1, 2018.

# Upcoming I-65 Construction



Late spring/early summer, the Indiana Department of Transportation will close portions of I-65 in Indianapolis for a bridge preservation project. This project, which will take approximately 35 days, is designed to extend the service life of seven bridges in this stretch of highway for an additional 10-15 years. This project and its impending closure will severely impact faculty, staff, students and visitors traveling to/from IUPUI.

The earliest construction start/closure date is June 1. The project must be completed by August 4. If the project extends beyond August 4, the contractors will be liable to pay damages of \$50,000 per day.

The project will close I-65 in both directions of travel between Meridian St. (exit 113) and 21st St. (exit 115).

Further closure details regarding I-65 Northbound (NB) are as follows:

- ⇒ All traffic will be required to exit at Pennsylvania/Meridian St. (exit 113)
- ⇒ Exits closed include West St. and 21st St./Senate Ave.
- ⇒ All on-ramps closed between Meridian St. and 21st St.
- ⇒ I-65 NB will reopen at the 21st St. on-ramp.

I-65 Southbound (SB) Closure details are as follows:

- ⇒ All traffic will be required to exit at 21st St. (exit 115)

- ⇒ Exits closed include 21st St., West St., and Meridian St.
- ⇒ All on-ramps closed between 21st St. and West St.
- ⇒ I-65 SB will reopen at the Delaware St. on-ramp (just west of I-65/I-70 split).

# The Collaborative Corner: IPE

Interprofessional education takes place when students from two or more professions learn about, from, and with each other to enable effective collaboration and improve health outcomes. IUSD faculty and students have been active in TEACH! (Team Education Advancing Collaboration in Healthcare), IU's official curriculum for teaching and assessing the foundational collaborative practice competencies across the health science schools. Launched system-wide in August 2017, TEACH! is a longitudinal, competency-based, curriculum which takes learners through a sequence of instruction, called Interprofessional Learning Anchors, from exposure (introduction) to immersion (development) to entry into practice (competence). Each four-hour Learning Anchor, which includes a uniprofessional preparation, an IPE face-to-face session, and assessment, is a required component of existing dental and dental hygiene courses. This academic year, along with learners from medicine, nursing, public health, physical

therapy, social work, and pharmacy, first and second year dental and dental hygiene students participated in TEACH!'s early Learning Anchors.

Recruited from each participating school and trained by the IU IPE Center, TEACH! facilitators are essential for student engagement and learning. Appreciation is extended to IUSD's facilitators for the March 7th sessions of the Anchor 3 simulation experience, Application of Interprofessional Teamwork Skills. If you are looking for ways to innovate your teaching, or an opportunity for professional development, becoming involved in TEACH! and IPE offer a pathway. As more student cohorts engage TEACH! additional

facilitators will be needed. Opportunities also exist to work with interprofessional faculty teams on curriculum development and assessment to ensure that oral health is present in interprofessional curricular components and clinical experiences.
